The contractor shall notify the Resident Construction Engineer (RCE) at least four (4) weeks prior to construction/demolition/maintenance of bridges and box culverts. The RCE will coordinate with SCDOT Environmental Services Office (ESO), Compliance Division, to determine if there are any active birds using the structure. After this coordination, it will be determined when construction/demolition/maintenance can begin. If a nest is observed that was not discovered after construction/demolition/maintenance has begun, the contractor will cease work and immediately notify the RCE, who will notify the ESO Compliance Division. The ESO Compliance Division will determine the next course of action.



SCDOT proposes to replace the S-42-31 (Cannons Campground Road) bridge over the Peters Creek in Spartanburg County. The project area is defined as that area within 75 feet of either side of the roadway centerline and extending approximately 1,500 feet on either side of the bridge. The archaeological survey examined the project area. The architectural survey examined the Area of Potential Effects (APE), which was defined as all above-ground resources with sightlines to the bridge. New South conducted background research and a cultural resources field survey in July of 2023 and created a short form report detailing the project (attached). The current survey consisted of a pedestrian reconnaissance of the entire APE augmented by the excavation of shovel tests. A total of 62 shovel test locations were investigated. Of these, 39 were not excavated due to the presence of disturbance in developed or modified areas or steep side slopes. All excavated shovel tests were negative for cultural material. The historic architecture survey identified four new resources and one sub-resource. SHPO Site Nos. 1798-1801 are front gabled residences constructed in the 1930s. SHPO Site No. 1800 has a circa-1973 garage (SHPO Site No. 1800.01). All resources were assessed as not eligible for the National Register of Historic Places (NRHP). The bridge to be replaced, Asset ID 4212, is a prestressed concrete channel beam structure that was constructed in 1963. This bridge was not recorded and evaluated for inclusion on the NRHP because it qualifies for streamlined review under the FHWA's Post-1945 Bridges Program Comment. No historic properties will be affected by this project. No additional cultural resources investigations are recommended.

#### **DESCRIPTION**:

The South Carolina Department of Transportation (SCDOT) proposes to replace various closed or load-restricted bridges including the S-42-31 (Cannons Campground Road) bridge over Peters Creek in Spartanburg County, South Carolina. The project area is defined as that area within 75 feet of either side of the proposed roadway centerline and extending 1,500 feet on either side of the bridge. The archaeological survey covered the entire project area, while the architectural survey examined the APE, which was defined as all above-ground resources with sightlines to the bridges. This cultural resource survey was performed under contract with HNTB.

#### LOCATION:

The project is located approximately 4.5 miles northeast of the city of Spartanburg in eastern Spartanburg County, South Carolina (Figure 1).

#### **ENVIRONMENTAL SETTING:**

The project area is situated in the Piedmont physiographic region, which is characterized by rolling hills formed from extensive weathering of ancient mountain ranges. The topography in the project area ranges from 770 feet above mean sea level (amsl) at the northern and southern ends of the project area to 700 feet amsl in the vicinity of Peters Creek. The surrounding landscape is mostly rural with forested private property along most of the project area, though modern residential and commercial buildings are present at the northern and southern ends of the project area. The Peter's Creek Heritage Preserve is located in the project area to the east of the bridge, along the creek. Vegetation in the southeastern portion consists of mixed pines and hardwoods with a moderate understory.

#### **NEAREST RIVER/STREAM AND DISTANCE:**

Peters Creek bisects the project area, joining Pacolet River approximately 2.2 miles east of the project area. Pacolet River (Hydrologic unit code [HUC] 0305010515) is a tributary of the Broad River (HUC 03050105) and joins the river in the southwestern-most corner of York County where it bounds with Cherokee and Union counties in South Carolina, approximately 27 miles southeast of the project area (South Carolina Department of Health and Environmental Control [SCDHEC] 2023).

#### **SOIL TYPE:**

Soils in the project area were formed from alluvium or residuum weathered from granite, gneiss, and/or diorite. The majority of the soils are well drained (85 percent), with 2.9 percent identified as somewhat poorly drained and 1.4 percent classified as water. The Natural Resource Conservation Service (NCRS) maps four soil types in the project area that are moderately or severely eroded (62.8 percent) (Table 1; Figure 2).

#### **CURRENT VEGETATION:**

The vegetation in the project area primarily consists of mixed pines and hardwoods with a moderate understory. The understory becomes very dense along the creek banks either side of the bridge. Many of the stands of trees are contained in the central portion of the project area, though modern residential and commercial buildings, as well as a portion of a solar farm, are present at the northern and southern ends of the project area. Additionally, exposed subsoil is present along a transmission line that runs along the eastern side of the project area. There are also several areas of spotty or fully exposed subsoil, and a large sewer line runs parallel to the road in the northwestern quadrant of the project area (Figures 3–6).

#### **INVESTIGATION:**

#### BACKGROUND RESEARCH

New South Associates, Inc. (NSA) conducted background research prior to fieldwork using the ArchSite GIS database maintained by the South Carolina Institute of Archaeology and Anthropology (SCIAA) and the South Carolina Department of Archives and History (SCDAH). The background research identified one previous survey and two previously recorded archaeological sites located within the 0.5-mile search radius (Figure 7). Neither site is within the project area.

Chicora Foundation conducted the linear survey in 2002. This intensive survey investigated an approximately 445-meter section of Cannons Campground Road and an approximately 210-meter section of Gossett Road in preparation for an intersection improvement. No sites were identified during this survey.

Archaeological site 38SP304 is located on Peters Creek to the east of the current project area. The site was originally recorded in 1998 as part of an investigative survey for the Peters Creek Wetlands Mitigation project. The site was identified as a grist mill dating to the nineteenth and early twentieth centuries and was likely associated with a nearby plantation owned by Vincent Wyat. The site was recommended for additional investigation to determine its eligibility for listing in the NRHP under Criteria C and D (Ledbetter and Gainey 1998). The site was revisited in 2002 as part of an additional investigative survey of Peters Creek and recommended eligible under Criteria C and D for listing in the NRHP (Braley 2002). Archaeological site 38SP488 is a glass scatter of unknown date located at the southern end of the project area that is listed as not eligible for the NRHP (Moss 2023).

#### **SURVEY RESULTS**

The cultural resources survey identified no archaeological sites or isolated finds within the project area. The architectural survey recorded four new resources and one sub-resource. The results of the cultural resources survey are discussed below.

#### **ARCHAEOLOGY**

The Phase I Archaeology Survey was conducted on July 25, 2023. Lauren Christian, MA, RPA, served as Field Director and was assisted in the field by Archaeological Technician John Tomko. The archaeological investigation included a pedestrian walkover of the entire project area and the excavation of shovel tests at 30-meter (100-foot) intervals within the project area. Shovel tests were placed along a single transect parallel to either side of Cannons Campground Road (State Road S-42-31). Soil profiles were recorded for all excavated shovel tests, and location data was recorded for all investigated shovel tests using handhold GPS instruments.

Sixty-two shovel test (ST) locations were plotted at 30-meter intervals across the project area. However, shovel tests that occurred in developed/heavily modified areas or on side slopes to the creek were not excavated. All other areas were documented by shovel test excavation or by examining exposed subsoil. As a result 23 shovel tests were either excavated or were documented based on surface visibility (Figure 8). Conditions in the field are summarized here. ST 1 occurred in an open field, ST 2 to ST 8 had been modified by development, ST 9 to ST 15 contained spotty exposed subsoil, while ST 16 to ST 17 sloped to Peter's Creek. ST 18 to ST 29 contained subsoil at the surface or just below the ground cover. ST 20 to ST 34 were modified or developed, ST 40 to ST 45 consisted of heavily eroded soils with subsoil at the surface or just below the ground cover, and STs 46 to ST 48 sloped to Peter's Creek. The remainder of the shovel tests from ST 49 to ST 62 existed within a large sewer line right of way located just within the woods line (see Figure 6). While not shovel tested, this area was subjected to pedestrian walkover.

One general soil profile was noted when subsoil was not on the surface, which consisted of approximately 30 centimeters of dark brown (10YR 3/3) sandy loam Ap horizon overlying a yellowish red (5YR 4/6) sandy clay subsoil (Figure 9). No archaeological sites or isolated finds were identified in the project area.

#### ARCHITECTURAL SURVEY

On August 25, 2023, Architectural Historian Sean Stucker, MHP, conducted the architectural survey of the APE, which was defined as all above-ground resources 50 years of age or older with sightlines to the bridge. Such resources were documented with South Carolina State Survey forms and photography and assessed for NRHP eligibility in accordance with the *South Carolina State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO) Survey Manual: South Carolina Statewide Survey of Historic Places*. Four architectural resources and one sub resource were recorded, but the bridge itself, constructed in 1963, was not evaluated per exemptions associated with the FHWA's Post-1945 Bridges Program Comment (U.S. Department of Transportation, Federal Highway Administration 2012). This bridge (ID 04212) is of a common type, with prestressed concrete channel beams and wood piers with cross bracing that are embedded into the creek banks (Figure 10). Newly identified resources are listed in Table 3 and depicted in Figure 11, and they are discussed below.

#### SHPO Site Number 1798 – 2671 Cannons Campground Road

Facing east from its site directly to the north of Peters Creek on Cannons Campground Road, SHPO Site Number 1798 is a small front-gabled house. Spartanburg County tax records list a build date of 1931, and it is visible on the earliest aerial photograph (1955) and topographical map (1949). It does not appear on a 1921 Spartanburg County soil survey map (NETRonline 2023; United States Department of Agriculture 1921). The building has some replacement materials but is consistent with 1930s construction, so this build date is assumed to be accurate. The one-story frame house has a rectangular plan and a modern V-crimp metal front-gabled roof (Figure 12). Vinyl siding covers the exterior, and the window frames and eaves are also covered in vinyl, and concrete block infill is found between the brick piers. The six-over-six sash windows are covered with storm windows, and two are found on the façade on either side of the off-center front door. Two more are located on the south elevation, and one is found on the north side. A smaller set of paired windows is also on the north side at the rear. The front door is accessed by a set of concrete stairs ascending to a wood-frame stoop that is covered by a small gable roof supported by decorative wrought iron columns. A rectangular louvered vent is centered in the gable peak of the façade. A shed roof addition that sits on a continuous concrete block foundation is appended to the rear, but most of the rear elevation is not visible.

SHPO Site Number 1798 shares the parcel with the neighboring SHPO Site Number 1799 and is located on the outskirts of Spartanburg. The area is rural but also has nearby suburban developments. Although SHPO Site Number 1798 is a circa 1931 front-gabled house, it is not a distinctive or noteworthy example of this house type, which is common in South Carolina. It was not found to embody the distinctive characteristics of a style, period, or method of construction, and does not possess significance for its engineering or materials. It is not known to be associated with events or persons significant in the past. Therefore, the resource is recommended as not individually eligible for the NRHP under Criteria A, B, or C.

#### SHPO Site Number 1799 – 2675 Cannons Campground Road

Facing east from its site on Cannons Campground Road and on the parcel adjacent to Peters Creek on its north side, SHPO Site Number 1799 is a plain front-gabled house. Spartanburg County tax records list a build date of 1931, and it is visible on the earliest aerial photograph (1955) and topographical map (1949) that could be located. It does not appear on a 1921 Spartanburg County soil survey map (NETRonline 2023; United States Department of Agriculture 1921). The building has some replacement materials but is consistent with 1930s construction, so this build date is assumed to be accurate.

The one-story frame house has a rectangular historic core and a modern V-crimp metal front-gabled roof (Figure 13). Vinyl siding covers the exterior, and the window frames and eaves are also covered in vinyl. The six-over-six sash windows are covered with storm windows and have faux shutters on all three visible elevations. Each visible elevation has two of these windows, with a third shorter window located at the rear on the north side and a smaller one-over-one window centered in the gable peak of the façade. A set of concrete stairs with concrete-capped, stepped brick sidewalls ascends to the engaged porch, which has a wood-frame deck and simple wooden railings on the two exposed sides. One façade window is centered in the right side of the façade, and the other is within the porch to the left of the front door, which has three vertically oriented lights in the upper half. The house has a continuous brick foundation with integrated diamond-pattern vents on the elevated sections (east and south elevations). A shed roof addition with railings that match those on the front porch is appended to the rear, but most of the rear elevation is not visible.

SHPO Site Number 1799 shares the parcel with the neighboring SHPO Site Number 1798. It is located on the outskirts of Spartanburg in an area that is rural but also has nearby suburban developments. Although SHPO Site Number 1799 is a circa 1931 front-gabled house, it is not a distinctive or noteworthy example of this house type, which is common in South Carolina. It was not found to embody the distinctive characteristics of a style, period, or method of construction, and does not possess significance for its engineering or materials. It is not known to be associated with events or persons significant in the past. Therefore, the resource is recommended as not individually eligible for the NRHP under Criteria A, B, or C.

#### SHPO Site Number 1800 and 1800.01 – 2679 Cannons Campground Road

Facing east from its site approximately 250 feet north of Peters Creek on Cannons Campground Road, SHPO Site Number 1800 is a modified front-gabled house. Spartanburg County tax records list a build date of 1940, and it is visible on the earliest aerial photograph (1955) and topographical map (1949) that could be located. It does not appear on a 1921 Spartanburg County soil survey map (NETRonline 2023; United States Department of Agriculture 1921). The building has some replacement materials but is consistent with 1940s construction, so this build date is assumed to be accurate.

The one-story frame house has a rectangular historic core and a composition shingle front-gabled roof (Figure 14). A laterally gabled addition, which is visible by the 1976 aerial imagery, is appended to the north side, and the windows in this section vary from those found in the original core. The original windows are six-over-six sash, and there are both single and paired sets. The addition has a set of paired four-over-four sash on the façade and two single one-over-one sash windows on its north side. The paired set at the rear of the south elevation are shorter than the others in the original core, and both the front door and the paired set to the right of it are beneath the front-gabled roof that shelters the front porch. A set of concrete stairs with concrete-capped, stepped brick sidewalls ascends to the porch, which has a concrete deck and iron balusters, corner columns, and railings. Aluminum siding covers the exterior, and the window frames and eaves are covered in vinyl with faux shutters flanking the façade and south elevation windows. Rectangular louvered vents are centered in all of the visible gable peaks, and an addition with a set of paired windows in its south side is visible appended to the rear of the original core, but most of the rear elevation is not visible. The house has a continuous brick foundation (including beneath both additions) with embedded vents visible only on the façade and porch foundation.

SHPO Site Number 1800.01 is a front-gabled frame garage building that faces east and that is set back nearly 200 feet from the roadway, so material details were difficult to discern and document (Figure 15). It is not visible in 1955 aerial imagery but is by 1976, so a build date of circa 1973 was assumed. It appears to have a composition shingle roof and lapped siding, though the material type is unclear. Two open garage bays with a dividing post in the center fill the entirety of the façade, and the left-side bay is slightly taller than the other. The side elevations were only partially visible from the right of way but appear to be unfenestrated.

SHPO Site Number 1800 is located on the outskirts of Spartanburg in an area that is rural but that also has nearby suburban developments. Although SHPO Site Number 1800 is a circa 1940 front-gabled house, it is not a distinctive or noteworthy example of this house type, which is common in South Carolina. Its integrity is, furthermore, impacted by the laterally gabled addition and replacement materials that include aluminum and vinyl cladding. Likewise, SHPO Site Number 1800.01 is a non-distinctive example of its similarly common building type, and neither were found to embody the distinctive characteristics of a style, period, or method of construction nor to possess significance for their engineering or materials. They are not known to be associated with events or persons significant in the past. Therefore, these resources are recommended as not individually eligible for the NRHP under Criteria A, B, or C.

#### SHPO Site Number 1801 – 2678 Cannons Campground Road

Facing west from its site approximately 400 feet north of Peters Creek on Cannons Campground Road, SHPO Site Number 1801 is a front-gabled house. Spartanburg County tax records list a build date of 1933, and it is visible on the earliest aerial photograph (1955) and topographical map (1949) that could be located. It does not appear on a 1921 Spartanburg County soil survey map (NETRonline 2023; United States Department of Agriculture 1921). The building has some replacement materials but is consistent with 1930s construction, so this build date is assumed to be accurate. Additionally, the building plan appears the same in the earliest aerial imagery as it does in the most recent in which the house is visible (2005-2006), so it does not appear to have received any additions over time.

The one-story frame house has a rectangular historic core and a front-gabled metal shingle roof and is surrounded by heavy foliage on its south and east sides, so only the façade and north elevation are observable (Figure 16). The observable standard-height windows are vertical four-over-one sash, except for a four-pane, square side-hinged window centered in the gabled roof structure that covers the front porch. This structure extends from the main front gable and is set about a foot lower, and both gable ends are clad with wood shingle siding. The porch roof structure is supported at the corners by tapered wood columns perched atop brick piers with concrete caps. It is also clad with metal shingles, and both the porch and main roof structures have exposed rafter tails on the lateral elevations, diagonal corner bracing on the gable ends, and overhanging exposed soffits. A second set of brick piers sans wood columns flank the stairs ascending to the porch, which contains a central doorway and unevenly spaced flanking windows. The primary exterior cladding is weatherboard, and the main foundation is obscured, though a continuous brick foundation is visible beneath the porch. One standard-height window and a second shorter window of indiscernible pattern are visible on opposite ends of the north elevation, which contains a double-leaf entry at center with a set of concrete steps leading up to it. This doorway does not appear to be original, and a modern 15-light door fills one opening, while the other was observed to be boarded or papered over. Multiple outbuildings are present on the site, but none are 50 years old or older; in fact, despite the seeming presence of one or more in the 1955 aerial imagery, none of those are extant, and none of the current outbuildings seem to appear in imagery prior to 2005, so none were assessed for their NRHP eligibility.

SHPO Site Number 1801 is located on the outskirts of Spartanburg in an area that is rural but that also has nearby suburban developments. Although SHPO Site Number 1801 is a circa 1933 front-gabled house, it is not a distinctive or noteworthy example of this house type, which is common in South Carolina. Its integrity is, furthermore, impacted by the doorway addition on the north elevation and (likely) added window in the front porch gable. It was not found to embody the distinctive characteristics of a style, period, or method of construction, and does not possess significance for its engineering or materials. It is not known to be associated with events or persons significant in the past. Therefore, the resource is recommended as not individually eligible for the NRHP under Criteria A, B, or C.

#### **REMARKS AND RECOMMENDATIONS:**

No archaeological sites or isolated finds were identified during the archaeological survey. Four new architectural resources (including one new sub-resource) were recorded, but none are recommended as eligible for the NRHP. The proposed project, as currently defined, would have no effects to historic properties.

Figure 1. Project Location Map





Figure 2. Soils Mapped in the Project Area




Figure 8. Shovel Test Results Map

# Natural Resources Technical Memorandum

S-31 (Cannons Campground Road) Bridge Replacement over Peters Creek

SCDOT Project ID: P041165



### Introduction

The South Carolina Department of Transportation (SCDOT) proposes to replace the S-31 bridge over Peters Creek in Spartanburg County, South Carolina. Specifically, the project is approximately 0.75 miles north of the City of Spartanburg. The project is located in the Upper Broad River Watershed (03050105 8-digit Hydrologic Unit Code) and the 45b Southern Outer Piedmont Level IV Ecoregion. Please see Attachment A, Figure 1 for a Site Location Map.

A Project Study Area (PSA) has been established, based on preliminary design, to encompass all potential impacts of the project. The PSA encompasses an area approximately 13.80 acres in size and approximately 3,007 feet (0.57 mile) in total length, generally centered on Peters Creek in either direction. Furthermore, the PSA is 200 feet in total width, generally centered on the centerline of Cannons Campground Road.

Robbins & DeWitt conducted a desktop analysis, scientific literature review, and field surveys for natural resources associated with the proposed bridge replacement. This technical memorandum provides a summary of methods and findings related to natural resources and potential project related impacts. Attached to this memorandum are supporting figures, a SCDOT Permit Determination Form, South Carolina Department of Health and Environmental Control (SCDHEC) Watershed and Water Quality Information Report, and a biological evaluation for federally protected species.

# **Desktop Analysis Methods**

A desktop analysis was completed as part of an initial evaluation of the PSA to identify key environmental resources to be considered for permitting and/or avoidance and minimization by the design team. The potential resources identified in the desktop evaluation were field verified by Robbins & DeWitt to ensure that critical regulatory items would not be adversely impacted by the project. The following resources were consulted during the desktop analysis:

### Jurisdictional Waters of the U.S.

After completing the desktop analysis, Robbins & DeWitt performed field reviews to determine the boundaries of jurisdictional waters of the U.S., including wetlands, in the PSA. Field reviews were conducted on July 26, 2023. A summary of jurisdictional features identified in the PSA is provided in Table

### **Permitting Considerations**

Based on the conceptual bridge design, impacts to jurisdictional waters have been avoided; therefore, a Section 404/401 permit is not anticipated. A completed SCDOT Permit Determination Form and SCDHEC Watershed and Water Quality Information Report are provided in Attachment B.

# Federally Protected Species

Environmental scientists performed literature and field reviews to determine the likelihood of protected species within the PSA and the potential for project-related impacts. Field reviews were conducted on July 26, 2023, April 16, 2024, and February 1, 2025. The SCDNR South Carolina Natural Heritage Species Viewer was also reviewed to determine the presence of known populations of protected species within the vicinity of the project. Based on the literature and field reviews it is determined that the proposed project will have a biological conclusion of 'no effect' on federally protected species. A Biological Evaluation is provided in Attachment C.

### Migratory Birds

Certain bird species are protected under the Migratory Bird Treaty Act of 1918. The USFWS IPaC online database was reviewed for information pertaining to migratory bird species. Migratory birds were not observed nesting on the existing bridge in February 2025.

### Vegetation

Land use in the PSA includes undeveloped forestland, utility corridors, and residential and commercial development. The vegetative communities observed within the PSA consists of small stream forest and mesic mixed hardwood. Refer to the Biotic Communities section in Attachment C for a detailed description of vegetation observed in the PSA.

# Soils

According to the (USDA-NRCS) Soil Survey Geographic (SSURGO) data, 6 Soil Map Units (SMU) and water (W) are mapped within the PSA. Each SMU IS included in Table 2 below.





# Attachment C

Biological Assessment - Section 7 of the Endangered Species Act



#### Introduction

The proposed project consists of replacing the S-31 (Cannons Campground Road) bridge over Peters Creek, and associated road work, in Spartanburg County, South Carolina.

Pursuant to Section 7 of the Endangered Species Act (ESA), a field survey was conducted within the Project Study Area (PSA) for the project. A Resource List was also requested from the USFWS Information for Planning and Consultation (IPaC) in January 2025, to detail protected species under USFWS jurisdiction that are known or expected to be in or near the project area. Table 1 below includes the species that appear on the IPaC Resource List.

### Federally Protected Species

Species with the federal classification of Endangered (E) or Threatened (T) or Threatened due to Similarity of Appearance (T [S/A]) are protected under the ESA of 1973, as amended (16 U.S.C. 1531 et seg.). Although Section 7 of the ESA does not provide protections for Candidate species, they are listed in Table 1 in the event of a status changes prior to completion of the project. Additionally, species that are proposed for listing are not subject to Section 7 compliance until the time they are formally listed. The bald eagle is protected by the Bald and Golden Eagle Protection Act (BGEPA) and is included in this evaluation.

### Methodology

Environmental scientists performed literature and field reviews to determine the likelihood of protected species within the PSA and the potential for project-related impacts. Field reviews were conducted on July 26, 2023, April 16, 2024, and February 1, 2025. The SCDNR South Carolina Natural Heritage Species Viewer was also reviewed to determine the presence of known populations of protected species within the vicinity of the project.

### **Biotic Communities**

Land use in the PSA includes undeveloped forestland, utility corridors, and residential and commercial development. The natural communities observed within the PSA consist of small stream forest and mesic mixed hardwood forest.

The small stream forest consists of an open to dense understory or shrub layer and a sparse to dense herb layer. The canopy has a mixture of bottomland and mesophytic trees including river birch (Betula nigra), sycamore (Platanus occidentalis), sweetgum (Liquidambar styraciflua), tulip poplar (Liriodendron tulipifera), American elm (Ulmus americana), hackberry (Celtis laevigata), green ash (Fraxinus pennsylvanica), and red maple (Acer rubrum). The subcanopy consists of young canopy species and many tall shrubs including pawpaw (Asimina triloba) and blackhaw (V. prunifolium). The herb layer contains cardinal flower (Lobelia cardinalis), longleaf lobelia (L. elongata), Nepalese browntop (Microstegium vimineum), netted chainfern (Woodwardia areolatea), royal fern (Osmunda regalis), and eastern marsh fern (Thelypteris palustris). Vine species are typically common and can include poison ivy (Toxicodendron radicans), summer grape (Vitis aestivalis), and crossvine (Bignonia capreolata).

The mesic mixed hardwood forest consists of a closed canopy, an open to sparse understory or shrub layer, and a sparse herb layer. The canopy, or overstory, comprises a mixture of many hardwoods including American beech (Fagus grandifolia), tulip poplar, white oak (Quercus alba), sweetgum, red maple, American hornbeam (Carpinus caroliniana), flowering dogwood (Cornus florida), and American holly (Ilex opaca). The understory consists of saplings of the overstory layer as well as invasive Chinese privet (*Lingustrum sinense*).

#### Results

Field reviews of the PSA found no suitable habitat for bald eagle.

The SCDNR South Carolina Natural Heritage Species Viewer identifies a known population of dwarfflowered heartleaf in the vicinity of the proposed project. Specifically, the population was last observed in 2021, approximately 200 feet west of Cannons Campground Road on the south side of Peters Creek. Coordination with SCDNR did not provide any further details about the specific location of the occurrence. Field surveys were conducted for the species during the USFWS-recommended survey window (March-May). The majority of the PSA, adjacent to Peters Creek, is maintained as part of an overhead utility corridor and dominated by successional species common to regularly maintained lands. Stream banks were found to be incised, unstable, and scoured by recent high-water events. No individuals of the species were identified within the proposed construction limits of the project.

Suitable habitat for tri-colored bat exists in the PSA. Roosting habitat exists under the existing Peters Creek bridge and in cavities and crevices of trees within the PSA. A structure survey of the existing bridge found no evidence of bat roosting. Property on the east and west side of the bridge are part of the SCDNR Peters Creek Heritage Preserve. Due to the proximity of the heritage preserve, tri-colored bats may utilize portions of the PSA for roosting and foraging. A Structures Survey Data Sheet and Habitat Assessment Data Sheet are included in Attachment D.

### **Conclusions**

Based on the field surveys conducted for the species, incised stream banks, and maintained nature of potential suitable habitat, the project will have a biological conclusion of 'no effect' on dwarf-flowered heartleaf.

The project team will re-evaluate the project's effect on tri-colored bats at the time the species is formally listed under the ESA, and, if necessary, initiate consultation at that time.

How is the probability of presence score calculated? The calculation is done in three steps:

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To properly present the pattern of presence across the year, the relative probability of presence is calculated. This is the probability of presence divided by the maximum probability of presence across all weeks. For example, imagine the probability of presence in week 20 for the Spotted Towhee is 0.05, and that the probability of presence at week 12 (0.25) is the maximum of any week of the year. The relative probability of presence on week 12 is 0.25/0.25 = 1; at week 20 it is 0.05/0.25 = 0.2.

The relative probability of presence calculated in the previous step undergoes a statistical conversion so that all possible values fall between 0 and 10, inclusive. This is the probability of presence score.

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#### Survey Effort ()

Vertical black lines superimposed on probability of presence bars indicate the number of surveys performed for that species in the 10km grid cell(s) your project area overlaps.

#### No Data ()

A week is marked as having no data if there were no survey events for that week.







### Package 21 (S-31) Public Meeting Report

### Meeting Purpose

One in-person public meeting was held to educate the public on the bridge replacement for the S-42-31 (Cannons Campground Road) Bridge over Peters Creek in Spartanburg County and potential impacts. A virtual public meeting was also available online, 24/7 where attendees could view the same information and materials from the in-person meeting and submit comments. The in-person and virtual meetings fell within the 30-day comment period for the project, which ran from January 22 to February 21, 2025.

### Meeting Details

The meeting was an open-house, drop-in style meeting in a multi-purpose room at Zion Hill Baptist Church in Spartanburg, SC. Attendees joined the meeting at any point from 5 to 7 PM to engage the project team, view meeting materials, and submit comments. The project team arrived on-site and began setup at 4 pm and doors opened early at 4:45 pm due to a large line of attendees. A security service, Bravo Protective Services, was on-site to provide security assistance at the in-person public meeting. A total of 152 individuals signed in at the in-person meeting. A copy of the sign-in sheets from the in-person meeting are included in **Appendix A**.

### Meeting Outreach

The public meeting was advertised and promoted through a variety of outreach methods to encourage attendance and increase public participation. A total of 3,153 postcards were delivered using Every Door Direct Mail between January 22 and 28, 2025 to raise awareness of the public meeting and virtual public meeting. The postcard included a map of the project location, information on the in-person and virtual meetings, a QR code and URL to the virtual meeting, the dates of the comment period, and contact information to submit comments. SCDOT also distributed a media alert on Friday, February 14, 2025, to raise awareness, increase online participation, and encourage public feedback. A copy of outreach materials have been included in **Appendix B**.

Requests for new bike/ped facilities	The scope for the bridge replacement is focused on replacing the existing structure to meet current safety and design standards and does not include bike and pedestrian improvements at this time.
Requests for additional travel lanes	SCDOT is proposing to replace the existing bridge structure to bring up to current standards which addresses previous structural deficiencies and removes existing load restrictions. The proposed bridge design does not include additional travel lanes; however, the proposed bridge and approaches will include wider shoulders.

Thank you for your comment on this proposed bridge replacement project.

SCDOT recognizes the need to restore connectivity, enhance safety, and reconnect the community. In consideration of many factors including, but not limited to: public feedback, high average daily traffic, lengthy detours, and adjacency to several education and medical facilities, we have received authorization to expedite the replacement of this bridge. This bridge will be replaced as a standalone project and separated out from Bridge Package 21 and will have a separate schedule. It is anticipated that construction on this replacement will begin in Summer 2025 and will be open to traffic within one-year from the start of construction. The proposed bridge will be designed in accordance to current SCDOT standards and specifications which include wider shoulders and increased structural capacity to eliminate the previous bridge's load restrictions.
