Project Update -December 2021

PROJECT INFORMATION

SCDOT is constructing a new interchange to allow for interstate access to the new Carolina Panthers development and surrounding areas as well reduce the traffic volumes utilizing the adjacent interchanges. The proposed interchange will provide access from I-77 to the new boulevard which is approximately 1 mile south of US 21 Bypass/Cherry Rd (Exit 82) and approximately 1.5 miles north of SC 122/Dave Lyle Blvd (Exit 79).

CURRENT ACTIVITIES


Work is going well. Earthwork is in the final stages on the West side and the East side is now beginning. Drainage activities are continuing on the project. Final dressing and seeding is occurring along the I-77 SB side along with fine grading and paving. The retaining walls are beginning to allow for the start of the primary bridge structure over I-77. Erosion Control and establishment of vegetation are ongoing.





PROJECT MILESTONES




Ready for Construction (RFC) have been approved. Plans for entire site have now been completed
