

I-77 PANTHER INTERCHANGE

Project Update -February 2022

PROJECT INFORMATION

SCDOT is constructing a new interchange to allow for interstate access to the new Carolina Panthers development and surrounding areas as well reduce the traffic volumes utilizing the adjacent interchanges. The proposed interchange will provide access from I-77 to the new boulevard which is approximately 1 mile south of US 21 Bypass/Cherry Rd (Exit 82) and approximately 1.5 miles north of SC 122/Dave Lyle Blvd (Exit 79).

CURRENT ACTIVITIES

Construction activities are progressing well. Retaining Wall Construction on both the West and East side of I-77 are ongoing. Bridge foundation work is being performed for the bridge that crosses I-77. Curb & gutter along with asphalt paving have been performed on western sections of One Carolina Drive near the future Carolina Panthers Practice facility. Temporary and permanent Erosion control and detention ponds are being installed throughout the project.
