

I-77 PANTHER INTERCHANGE

Rock Hill, SC • York County

Project Update - August 2022

PROJECT INFORMATION

SCDOT is constructing a new interchange near mile marker 81 to allow for interstate access to a new development and surrounding areas as well reduce the traffic volumes utilizing the adjacent interchanges. The proposed interchange will provide access from I-77 to the new boulevard which is approximately 1 mile south of US 21 Bypass/Cherry Rd (Exit 82) and approximately 1.5 miles north of SC 122/Dave Lyle Blvd (Exit 79).

CURRENT ACTIVITIES

Bridge Deck pours began this past month on the I-77 bridge. The first pour consisted of almost 550 cubic yards. The bridge beams for the NB Exit ramp bridge are scheduled to be set this month. The milling and placement of asphalt on I-77 is scheduled to begin the middle of August. Earthwork is continuing along with retaining wall construction. Curb & gutter, barrier wall and concrete flat work are also scheduled for August.









